Visitors

ALL visitors coming to school, during school hours, will need to enter through the front door and check in with the office staff. If you are a first-time visitor, you will need to have your drivers license with you in order to check in through our Raptor System.

Attendance

We at Carver want to stress the importance of on-time and daily attendance at school. That is why we have decided to step up our efforts to ensure that students are:

1) attending school every day we are in session, 2) arriving to school on time, and 3) remaining in school for the entire day.

Frequent tardies or absences greatly interfere with a child's learning and growth that is so crucial at the elementary school level. Additionally, excessive tardies and absences can cause unnecessary stress on children and may send the message that school attendance is important. Habits formed at this stage in children's lives will often stay with them and influence attitudes in later years. Our goal is that the habit punctuality and daily attendance will become innate as they go forth as adults into the workplace.

With our change over to Infinite Campus, students will marked one of two ways (see below) for their daily attendance. Regardless of the reason for the absence or tardy, it will be marked as unexcused. Please know that with each absence or tardy a comment will be placed in the comment box on Infinite Campus (i.e. ill, bereavement, out of town, etc.). These comments will be based on the information given by the parent/guardian as to the reason for your child's absence.

- Absent Unexcused (AUX) Student is not in school
- Tardy Unexcused (TUX)
 Student is late (not in their classroom) to the beginning of the school day OR leaves school before the end of the school day

Open House

We will host our annual Open House on Tuesday, September 11 from 5:30-6:30 p.m. Families are welcome to visit their child's classroom and other teachers (i.e. PE, Music, Art, etc.) during this time. We look forward to seeing each of you on September 11 at our Open House.

Arrival and Dismissal <u>Procedures</u>

For the safety of our students staff, please be sure and follow the established procedures for our arrival and dismissal times. Staff who are supervising the parking lot or crosswalks are easily identified by wearing a fluorescent vest. Our number one concern, during arrival and dismissal, is getting students to and from school safely. We greatly appreciate your efforts to keep our students and staff safe. A couple additional notes about arrival and dismissal times:

- AM Drop-Off: Please remain in your vehicle and have your child exit out on the right side of the vehicle. This should be a "drop and go" process. We ask that parents allow staff to assist those students who need it. NOTE: There is NO parking in the Drop-Off Lane.
- PM Pick-Up: Please remain in your vehicle and pull forward as far as possible. Students will use the sidewalk to get to your vehicle in the pick-up lane. Staff will assist students getting to their vehicle. NOTE: There is NO parking in the Pick-Up Lane

- Pets (i.e. dogs) are not <u>allowed</u> on school grounds during arrival and dismissal times
- Students riding a bike, scooter, etc. should walk them across crosswalks and while on school grounds
- Please be sure to contact the school office by 2:00 p.m. if you need to communicate dismissal information to your child.

Celebration Guidelines

Birthdays and holidays are so exciting to celebrate! We often celebrate these special occasions with snacks, but, due to our district wellness policy and a growing number of allergies in the classrooms, we ask that you **DO_NOT** send edible treats. Of course, we will continue to celebrate special occasions at school, but in different ways. Although it is not expected, you may choose to send something for a special occasion. If you do, we require that it be nonedible. Please contact your child's homeroom teacher if you have any regarding questions these guidelines. Below are a few ideas you can send to school instead of an edible treat:

 pencils, erasers, stickers, chalk, bubbles, a box of crayons, notepads, bookmarks, rings, bracelets, wrist bands, play dough, fun straws, stamps, or donate a book/game to the classroom.
